We need to make sure that people know that if they're going to use the internet, they need to be smart about it. They need to be careful about what they do and who they do it with.

- (5) We also need to have stronger laws in place that punish those who commit cybercrime. We can't just hope that people will stop committing crimes because they'll get caught eventually. We need to make sure that the punishment for these crimes is severe enough so that people will think twice before doing anything illegal online.
- (6) Finally, we need to develop better ways of detecting and stopping cybercrime before it happens in the first place. There are a lot of different ways that we can do this, but one important way is to use technology. We can use sensors and software to monitor our networks for signs of trouble, and then take action when we find them. This kind of technology has already started being used in some cases and it's helping us catch criminals more easily. 
